One of the highlights of the year was our "Raise the Glass" event. It provided a relaxed setting to connect with current and potential members, celebrate our






shared progress, and introduce the various ASHRAE committees. The event also served as a platform to encourage greater involvement and participation in chapter activities, especially through committee engagement.


